Organizational Update

The board continues to evolve, expand and improve the capacity of the organization. A second member survey garnered 107 responses! This provided more input from members to the board and helped to identify 6 new board members! The board is grateful for the contributions of board members Cheryl Turner, John Hutchison, and Tom Corcoran who stepped off the board in 2020. A virtual board retreat took place across two Zoom meetings in the fall, giving the board more time to dig into topics in depth. Our heartfelt thanks to member Ken Patterson who did a terrific job of facilitating our retreat as a professional service donation.

A working group was established to discuss ways to expand member engagement, advocacy and education. Three issues of the Camel Express newsletter were distributed to the membership electronically. Our Facebook group was reformed to be an open, public forum for all things related to Niger and connecting members and interested folks. FON developed a meaningful profile on Guidestar.

One Family One Garden


Building on previous success with moringa gardens, FON has provided support to Infirmiere d'Etat Moustapha Harou to improve nutrition for families in the Dakoro area with kitchen gardens maximizing greywater. FON funds have supported purchase of fencing materials to protect the gardens from animals, water containers, and garden tools, as well as an assessment of how well the 'greywater' approach has worked. This project was funded in late 2019.

Solar Electrification of Health Clinics

We learned that solar electric systems installed in clinics needed some follow up and adjustment. Systems that had previously been installed proved to have poor performing batteries, thereby limiting their capacity and usefulness. This was remedied by providing an

additional grant to upgrade the systems on the already installed clinic solar systems.





School feeding program and Medicines for Niger

Kirker Foundation/Niger is a Nigerien NGO that works to increase availability, access, and utilization of quality medicines and supplies in medical facilities in Niger, especially in remotes areas. Kirker Foundation/Niger partners and coordinates with a wide range of government and non-government entities in Niger and abroad to secure medicines, supplies, and support resources to provide essential medical supplies where needed.

In 2020, FON approved a grant of \$7,500 to Support and emergency feeding program and transport a shipment of medicines. Nutrition packets from Rise Against Hunger were contributed to a school feeding program for nomadic children in Wambouzou in the Tchintabaraden region. Other funds were used for incountry clearance and distribution of medical supplies from a shipment, Including 120,000 surgical and N95 masks for use in slowing the spread of COVID-19, antibiotics, oral hydration supplies, and prenatal vitamins. The MAP shipment was valued at almost

\$16 million and will be distributed to hospitals and health centers throughout Niger.

An additional \$10,000 grant to Kirker Foundation/ Niger was granted to cover in-country costs for two more shipments. As with previous shipments, the medicines and supplies were selected in close cooperation with the Ministry of Health to ensure they are used appropriately throughout Niger's health care system, greatly expanding the capacity to meet the needs during the pandemic. Support to Women's Organizations to Implement Micro-credit Programs



FON provided support for training for a micro-credit program in the Tchintabaraden region. Working with Filles, Femmes et Developpement (FIFED) a training was provided for women prior to their launching a microcredit program. The training was conducted by Potentiel Terre in coordination with TCP Global who will provide the initial loan funding to this and other sites in Niger. The loan program was launched successfully and Potential Terre established contacts with local banks and financial entities that will help with future work.

Micro-credit Training for Filles, Femmes Et Developpement (FIFED)

Emergency Assistance for Malaria Prevention in Flooded Areas

Heavy rainfall over several weeks damaged homes and crops, and resulted in severe flooding that left conditions perfect for breeding mosquitos that transmit malaria. FON moved quickly to provide emergency assistance to Nigerien NGO's in several regions. FON members responded to a special appeal allowing FON to provide \$10,592 to six different non-profits. Funds were used to purchase and distribute insecticide-impregnated mosquito nets and antimalarial drugs, and other related support.
