# 1) Nine grants awarded in May

The grant review team has completed another successful round of grant reviews! Friends of Niger selected 9 projects for funding in May. All unsuccessful applicants were given feedback about what the review team liked and what would have made their proposal more competitive. Many thanks to our review team:

A total of \$32,421 project support was authorized by the board thanks to the generous contributions of the members of the Friends of Niger. Volunteers have also stepped up to be project champions and liaisons for the following funded projects.

• **Rural Vocational Training** \$750. ONG DIMA. Artisan training will be provided in rural areas starting with soap making pilot with women in Hamdallaye.

- **CSI Water System** *1,350,000 CFA*. ONG AFAA. A water system will be improved for a rural health clinic in the Agadez region.
- Malaria Prevention Niamey 557,000 CFA. ONG Failatoul Hairan (La Bienfaisance). Mosquito nets, medication and training will be provided to help prevent malaria for vulnerable pregnant women and children in Niamey.
- **CSI solar Yekoua** *2,068,323 CFA*. Fédération Rayuwar Karkara des réseaux Mata Masu Dubara (MMD). Solar panels will be installed to provide 24 hour electricity to rural health clinic in Zinder region.
- Milk Cows Abalak 2,850,000 CFA. Société Coopérative Simplifiée des Femmes Couturières "FAKRU". Milk production will be increased by adding dairy cows to existing sheep herd.
- **Sheep Fattening Agadez** *2,769,980 CFA***.** ONG APR EMITTI. Livestock will be purchased and training provided for women's cooperative sheep fattening program.
- **Sheep Husbandry Balleyara** *3,185,000 CFA***.** ONG ODI Niger. Sheep will be purchased and training in animal husbandry will be provided to 20 disabled women.
- **School WASH Aguie** \$2,500. Remember Niger Coalition. Latrines and a WASH station will be constructed at a middle school in Aguie.

An Award of 2,922,500 CFA was made to fence a garden in the Zinder region contingent on a well being funded by another donor Subsequently, the well proved far too expensive and the project was abandoned.

### 2) Monitoring and site visits

Board member Alhassan Ali Mamadou Souna is a rock star! During his annual visit back home he has taken time away from friends and family to conduct sites visits to several FON projects. He has been dropping in on ongoing grants to meet with grantees and see how the projects are doing. Pictured here he visited 1) the malaria prevention project in Niamey, 2) the project to use biocontrol against millet miner in the Dosso region and 3) the artisan training programs in Niamey by DIMA. At the artisan training center he was joined by FON members Bill Miles and Scott Youngstedt. We look forward to hearing more about what he learned during his visits when he returns.

## 3) Grantees keeping us up to date: reports from the field

#### Rapport de mission: Sheep husbandry project for handicapped women in Balleyara

Submitted by ODI - Organisation pour un Développement Inclusif

Dans le cadre de la mise en œuvre du projet : **Petite ferme d'élevage de moutons pour accroître l'autosuffisance des femmes handicapées et non handicapées dans la Commune de Balleyara**, une mission composée du Secrétaire Exécutif et d'un chauffeur été faite dans la commune de Tagazar/Balleyara en compagnie du Superviseur de ladite zone (Harouna) comme prévue, le Dimanche 21 Mai 2023. L'objectif de cette mission est d'une part, prendre contact avec les autorités municipales et les femmes bénéficiaires afin de les informer de l'acception de leur projet intitulé : « Petite ferme d'élevage des moutons pour accroitre l'autosuffisance des femmes handicapées et non handicapées dans la CR de Balleyara ».

D'autre part organiser une réunion avec les bénéficiaires pour élaborer une liste des bénéficiaires et rappeler de leurs engagements pris qui constituent d'ailleurs les premiers critères d'éligibilité avant l'octroi des animaux. Il s'agit de la:

- Construction des hangars;
- Disponibilité d'une mangeoire ;
- Disponibilité des sceaux ;
- Disponibilité d'au moins un sac de son ;
- Disponibilité d'un stock minimum de paille et des produits de déparasitage.

Tous les membres du groupement Fama ont lu et accepté et signé les engagements en présence du représentant du Maire de la commune de Balleyara.

## 4) Call for applications: respond no later than September 1, 2023

#### To all interested parties:

Friends of Niger (FON) is a non-profit association with the objective of promoting activities that promote the well-being of Niger and especially the Nigerien people. FON uses a competitive process for project funding, and we are currently launching a call for projects. Our grant-making program is designed to support projects that originate from and are supported by local people, meet the criteria for success, and have the potential to have a lasting positive impact.

Applications for funding must be received by September 1, 2023. All eligible applications will compete for available funds based on their score after evaluation by a committee. Note that the results of the competition will be announced on November 1, 2023, and the allocation of funds is expected after this date, so proposed projects must be scheduled to begin no earlier than mid-November.
