This project will improve the nutrition of at least 30 women and 75 children in ABC village by increasing their ability to produce and prepare their own food.

Objectives:

- 1) Establish a community garden to grow vegetables and moringa
- 2) Improve basic gardening and management skills to create a sustainable garden
- 3) Improve skills in preparation of nutritious foods for children

- 1) Mme Amina will work with local community leaders to select 30 women with children who will participate based on nutritional need and their willingness to contribute. Initial nutritional status of women and children will be measured using an accepted metric (BMI, weight, etc).
- 2) Mme Amina will work with the chef du village to secure 1 hectare of garden space with access to water supply for irrigation. Participants and community members will construct a fence to keep animals out.
- 3) Mme Amina will procure vegetable seeds and moringa trees to be planted by participating women.
- 4) Agriculture agent will provide 2 3-hour classes for 30 women to teach these basic gardening skills: soil preparation, irrigation techniques, planting, weeding, harvesting, seed saving, use of compost for weed control and soil amelioration. Two follow-up visits will be made during each growing season to provide technical assistance.
- 5) Sage Femme will provide training on preparation of nutritious foods and the nutritional status of the children using the same metric as described in action #1
- 6) Mme Amina will work with the Association Des Femmes and participating women to form a group and establish a system to pay for ongoing purchases of seeds, supplies, fencing repairs, and maintenance of the water source as needed
- 7) Participants will keep records of the quantity of produce the gardens yield and evaluate the health of women and children after the first and second season of gardening.

- Total CFA contributed to community garden maintenance fund, and current balance

Who/How/When

At the beginning of the project the Sage Femme will take note of the health status of the children of participants.

Early in the project Mme Amina will work with the women's group to help them establish a record keeping system to record amount of produce produced in the gardens. This will be reviewed at the end of the project.

The Agriculture Agent and Sage Femme will track participation in trainings and will share their observations and recommendations with the participants during visits to facilitate ongoing improvements. They will also share results and observations with Mme Amina to be incorporated into reports to Friends of Niger.

The chef du village sent a request to Gardens For All Niger, on behalf of local women who asked him for help establishing a garden. The chef du village has pledged to provide a 1-hectare area to be used for the garden. The women and their families will work together to build the fence of local materials they collect. The Agriculture Agent and Sage Femme will provide expertise, training and support to the women. The women themselves will cultivate the gardens and participate in offered trainings sessions.

The Association des femmes du region will provide training and assist with the formation of the women's group. They support development of women's groups throughout the region.
